

# Rubric for Scholarship Scoring

## **Application - Points are earned by description – 5 points possible**

- 1 point if **neatly** filled out
- 1 point if **completely** filled out
- 2 points if all required items submitted
- 1 point if on-time, to be confirmed by Scholarship Chairperson

## **Academics - Points are earned from GPCA - 10 points possible**

- 1 point if GPA is 2.5 - 3.0
- 4 points if GPA is 3.1 - 3.5
- 10 points if GPA is 3.6 or above

## **Letter of Reference–10 points possible**

- 3 .0 total points if only one letter is attached
- 5.0 total points if two letters are attached
- 5.0 bonus points if one letter is from a teacher whose class you are currently in or were last year, proof required.

## **School and Outside Activities – 10 points possible**

- 2 points for any jobs held within the past 2 years
- 2 points for each club or sport you belong to
- Cannot exceed 10 point cap for scoring purposes

## **Service to Community – excluding GPCA/GPPD – 14 Points possible**

- 2 points for each volunteer activity in past 2 years
- Cannot exceed 14 point cap for scoring purposes

## **GPCA/GPPD Involvement – 21 Points possible**

- 3 points for each activity in the past 2 years only not to exceed 21 points

## **Essay – 15 points**

- 2 points if 250 words or more
- 12 points to possibly earn if included in essay (4 pts if included future aspirations), (4 points if included why you chose this field), (4 pts for your contribution to the world as adults)
- 1 point for proper Grammar

## **Interview – 15 points possible**

- 3 points if dressed appropriately
- 3 points for arriving on time
- 3 points for eye contact
- 6 points for thoroughly answered questions

This scoring system could make scoring very close and have possibilities of ties

Tie breakers – Total points of Higher GPCA/GPPD activities plus Academics
